When you begin reading Paul's letter to the church in Philippi, you would think that this was the greatest church ever!

He wrote, "I thank my God upon every remembrance of you ... for your fellowship in the gospel from the first day until now" (Philippians 1:3-5).

Near the end of the letter, however, Paul entreated two godly women, who had worked with him from the very beginning to start this church, to put aside their differences and find reconciliation.

Taking a closer look at Philippians, you find that unity is a theme running throughout the whole book! Truly, finding unity in the midst of differing opinions and preferences and history can be a challenge. But Christ's prayer for His Church today is that we might be one, as a testimony to the world (John 17:20-23).

Unity has been the theme Pastor Woods has been emphasizing in our midweek services. Just as in a song there may be four parts - four difference voices and notes, when those voices are united, the result is a beautiful harmony.
